Interventional radiology is an approach to care for patients who can benefit from minimally invasive image-guided therapies. Advancements in interventional care afford improved patient care, quality and overall outcomes. These new therapies are best served with a multidisciplinary team approach coordinated by a health care team of different specialties involved in the treatment. The development of multidisciplinary care teams has been shown to improve the outcome of patients.

This course will focus on three core competencies: medical knowledge, patient care and procedural skills, and practice-based learning and improvement. It will include a series of case presentations, discussions and interactive learning focused on addressing the advanced minimally invasive image-guided therapies and multidisciplinary management.
