DIRECTIONS

This program will be held at the Hyatt Regency Greenwich, 1800 E Putnam Ave, Old Greenwich, CT 06870.

Coming from the South/ NY/ I-95 N / Bruckner Expy. At exit 5 off I-95, take ramp right for US-1 toward Old Greenwich / Riverside. Turn right onto US-1 / E Putnam Ave. Continue for 0.7 mile. Destination will be on the right.

Coming from the North/ MA/ I-84/ CT 15-S / I-91 S / I-95 S. Continue onto I-84. Entering Connecticut, use the left 2 lanes to take exit 57 for CT-15 S toward I-91 S/Charter Oak Bridge/NY City. Continue onto CT-15 S. Take exit 86 to merge onto I-91 S toward New Haven/New York City. Continue for approximately 17 miles and take exit 17 to merge onto CT-15 S/Wilbur Cross Pkwy. Continue to follow CT-15 S for approximately 30 miles. Take exit 52 for State Route 108 S/State Route 8 S toward Bridgeport (0.6 mi). Keep left, follow signs for CT-8 S/Bridgeport and merge onto CT-8 S (5.2 mi). Take the Interstate 95 S exit toward N.Y. City and merge onto I-95 S. Continue on I-95 S for approximately 23 miles. Take exit 5 for US 1 N, turn right onto US-1 N. Continue for 0.7 mile. Destination will be on the right.

Coming from the East / RI / I-95 S. Take I-95 S in Richmond from RI-102 N and RI-3 S. Follow I-95 S to US-1 N in Greenwich. Take exit 5 from I-95 S. Turn right onto US-1 N. Continue for 0.7 mile. Destination will be on the right.
